CONSENT~ DELTA PUMP STATION EMERGENCY

Subject:

Delta Pump Station Emergency

The Delta Pump Station continues to operate under emergency resolution until repairs are completed.

With the City Council approval of the NADBank Grant Execution on 04.09.2024, NADBank has authorized the City to proceed with ordering the new pump (\$65,008.00 plus tax) and to proceed with the rebuild of the two existing pumps (\$45,000 estimated plus tax). The lead time per the manufacture for the new pump is 30-34 working weeks. The cost for the pump and rebuilds will be reimbursed by the \$250,000 grant funding. As a reminder, the City will have a matching of 10% to the cost of the Delta Pump Station Project.

# MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Centinela State Prison And Calipatria Fire Department

This Agreement is made and entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2024 or Upon Approval (whichever is later), between the Calipatria Fire Department (CPT FIRE) and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) / Centinela State Prison (CEN).

#### 1. OBJECTIVES

To make resources of the CDCR, CEN Fire Department and the CPT FIRE available to prevent and combat the effect of disasters which may result from such calamities as storm, flood, fire, earthquake, war, sabotage, and riot.

Each of the parties hereto should voluntarily aid and assist each other in the event that a disaster should occur, by the interchange of services and facilities including but not limited to fire, rescue, relief and communications to cope with the problems of rescue, relief, and evacuation arising in the event of a disaster.

It is necessary and desirable that a cooperative agreement be executed for the interchange of such mutual aid on a local basis.

#### 2. RESPONSE PLAN

#### A. RESPONSE AREA SPECIFICS

The response area covered under the general guidelines of this agreement is not to exceed the boundaries within the Operational Area. (Refer to Exhibit A-1, Operational Area Map).

In the event resources are needed outside the local operational area, notification must be made to the responding party's Emergency Operations Coordinator.

#### **B. GUIDELINES GOVERNING RESPONSE**

Upon requests for mutual aid assistance, the requested fire service organization will send equipment, personnel, and other resources as available to any area within the Operational Area. The authority in charge of the agency called for assistance shall be the sole judge of how much assistance can be furnished under the circumstances of each particular case. It is agreed that neither party in this agreement shall be liable in any way to the other, or its inhabitants or any other person, firm or corporation for failure to give assistance as requested.

#### C. RESOURCE AVAILABILITY

In the event that resources are unavailable for response, notification shall be made to appropriate emergency operations center and/or local agency. Once resources are

restored and available for response, notification shall be made to appropriate emergency operation centers and/or local agency to indicate availability.

#### D. TYPES OF RESPONSES COVERED

The base premise of this plan assumes that any specific resources identified by this plan to be dispatched are available and in their respective normally assigned response area. Should this not be the case at the time of the dispatch, the resources dispatched by either agency will be the closest available resources.

#### **E. PROTECTIVE CLOTHING**

It shall be the responsibility of the agency sending emergency personnel to ensure that such personnel are provided protective clothing and equipment as required by California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 8, Article 10.1., Section 3401 through 3410.

#### F. COMMUNICATIONS CAPABILITIES

It shall be the responsibility of the jurisdiction sending requested resources to ensure that responding personnel and equipment have adequate communications capability and that such communications be interoperable.

Fire and Rescue Dispatch Center is the El Centro Dispatch which is adequately equipped for emergency operations and operates 24-hours a day, 365 days a year. It is equipped to permit direct communications with all fire and rescue service agencies within their area of operations. It is staffed with competent personnel and equipped with such maps, charts, records and operational data as are necessary to perform emergency operations. Alternate Fire and Rescue Dispatch Centers should have the same capability as primary center, thus ensuring continued operations in the event of failure of the primary centers.

#### G. DISPATCH

Any dispatch of equipment and personnel pursuant to this agreement is subject to the following condition:

Any request for mutual aid hereunder shall be written or verbal and will include a statement of the requested resources and shall specify the location of the response. A verbal request shall be made by contacting Centinela State Prison's Central Control at (760) 337 7900 extension 5577, which is monitored 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

#### H. CONTROL OF RESOURCES

Responding mutual aid units will come under the direction of the Incident Commander within whose jurisdiction the emergency has occurred. However, the providing jurisdiction shall supervise and direct their own personnel and equipment as far as is possible, consistent with the direction of the Incident Commander.

#### I. RELEASE OF RESOURCES

A responding agency shall be released by the requesting organization when, in the judgment of the Incident Commander, the services of the responding party are no longer needed. The responding agency may be recalled by its fire chief or his/her designated representative, if in their opinion, a need exists for the responding party to render services within the agency's normal service area.

#### 3. CIVIL RIGHTS

The extension of benefits under the provisions of this agreement shall be without discrimination as to age, handicap, race, creed, sex, or national origin.

#### 4. NON-DISCRIMINATION

The parties of this agreement shall comply with all Federal statutes relating to nondiscrimination. These include but are not limited to: (a) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d through 2000d-6); (b) Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683, and 1685-1686), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; (c) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disabilities and provides for "reasonable accommodation" in hiring of persons with disabilities; (d) The Older American Act of 1965 as amended (42 U.S.C. 3056 and 6101 et. seq.); and (e) USDA 9 AR, Title VI Implementation Regulations.

#### 5. AMENDMENTS

This agreement may only be amended by written mutual consent of the parties hereto.

#### 6. TERMINATION

This agreement shall remain in effect until June 30, 2029. It may be terminated by any one of the parties hereto upon a thirty (30) day notice in writing to the other party.

#### 7. COMPENSATION

No party to this agreement will be required to pay any monetary compensation to any other party to this agreement for services rendered hereunder, the mutual advantage and protection afforded by this agreement being considered adequate compensation to all parties.

The party receiving aid will be responsible for providing supplies and material, such as gasoline, oil, food and water for on-site use of equipment, and for the personnel who are engaged in providing aid hereunder.

This agreement is intended to cover day-to-day mutual aid only, and shall be of no effect at times when the State of California, Master Mutual Aid Agreement becomes operative.

#### 8. INDEMNITY

Each party, in consideration of this Agreement to provide emergency assistance, does waive any and all claims against the other party for damages or compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, death, or any other matter occurring as a consequence of the performance under this agreement.

The parties hereto agree that Centinela State Prison, its inmates, agents, employees and officers shall not be considered an employee or agent of CAL FIRE in the performance of this agreement. In addition, it is mutually agreed that Centinela State Prison and/or its inmates will not be used to replace or be used in lieu of CAL FIRE employees.

The parties hereto agree that CAL FIRE, it's agents, employees and officers shall not be considered an employee or agent of Centinela State Prison in the performance of this agreement.

It is recognized that the interests herein are mutual, and the agreement is entered into for the common good of the general public and CDCR of the parties hereto, and for strictly governmental purposes.

#### 1. Right to Terminate (Supersedes provision number 7, Termination for Cause, of Exhibit C)

The parties hereto agree that either party may cancel this Agreement by giving the other party written notice thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date of such cancellation. In the event of such termination.

The State may terminate this Agreement should the Contractor fail to perform the requirements of this Agreement at the time and in the manner herein provided. In the event of such termination the State may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by the State.

#### 2. Liability for Loss and Damages

Any damages by the Contractor to the State's facility including equipment, furniture, materials, or other State property, will be repaired or replaced by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the State at no cost to the State.

#### 3. Extension of Term

When it is determined to be in the best interest of the State, this Agreement may be amended to extend the term for services as agreed upon by the parties.

#### 4. Security Clearance/Fingerprinting

The State reserves the right to conduct fingerprinting and/or security clearance through the Department of Justice, Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information (BCII), prior to award and at any time during the term of the Agreement, in order to permit Contractor and/or Contractor's employee access to State premises. The State further reserves the right to terminate the Agreement should a threat to security be determined.

#### 5. <u>Tuberculosis (TB) Testing</u>

In the event that the services required under this Agreement will be performed within a CDCR institution/parole office/community-based program, Contractors and their employees who are assigned to work with, near, or around inmates/parolees shall be required to be examined and tested or medically evaluated by a licensed healthcare provider for TB in an infectious or contagious stage prior to the performance of contracted duties, and at least once a year thereafter (within 12 months of their initial or previous TB test under this contract), or more often as directed by CDCR.

Contractors and their employees who have any contact (physical or nonphysical) with inmates/parolees, shall be required to furnish to the CDCR Program/Institution Contract Manager, at no cost to CDCR, a documented Tuberculosis (TB) evaluation/test for TB infection (Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) or a blood test Interferon Gamma Release Assay (IGRA) completed within (30) thirty days of the start date of the services and be certified to be free of TB in an infectious or contagious stage by a licensed healthcare provider prior to assuming their contracted duties and annually thereafter.

The following provisions apply to services provided on departmental and/or institution grounds:

#### 6. Bloodborne Pathogens

Contractor shall adhere to California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CAL-OSHA) regulations and guidelines pertaining to bloodborne pathogens.

## 7. <u>Primary Laws, Rules, and Regulations Regarding Conduct and Association with State</u> Prison Inmates and Division of Juvenile Justice Wards

Individuals who are not employees of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), but who are working in and around inmates who are incarcerated, or wards who are housed within California's institutions/facilities or camps, are to be apprised of the laws, rules and regulations governing conduct in associating with prison inmates or wards. The following is a summation of pertinent information when non-departmental employees come in contact with prison inmates or wards.

By signing this contract, the Contractor agrees that if the provisions of the contract require the Contractor to enter an institution/facility or camp, the Contractor and any employee(s) and/or subcontractor(s) shall be made aware of and shall abide by the following laws, rules and regulations governing conduct in associating with prison inmates or wards:

a. Persons who are not employed by CDCR but are engaged in work at any institution/facility or camp must observe and abide by all laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct of their behavior in associating with prison inmates or wards. Failure to comply with these guidelines may lead to expulsion from CDCR institutions/facilities or camps.

SOURCE: California Penal Code (PC) Sections 5054 and 5058; California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Sections 3285 and 3415, and California Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC) Section 1712.

- CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all prison inmates, wards, visitors, and employees shall be made aware of this.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 5054 and 5058; CCR, Title 15, Section 3304 and 4603; WIC Section 1712.
- c. All persons entering onto institution/facility or campgrounds consent to search of their person, property or vehicle at any time. Refusal by individuals to submit to a search of their person, property, or vehicle may be cause for denial of access to the premises.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 2601, 5054 and 5058; CCR, Title 15, Sections 3173, 3177, 3288, 4696, and 4697; WIC 1712.
- d. Persons normally permitted to enter an institution/facility or camp may be barred, for cause, by the CDCR Director, Warden, and/or Regional Parole Administrator.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 5054 and 5058; CCR, Title 15, Section 3176(a) and 4696; WIC Section 1712.
- e. It is illegal for an individual who has been previously convicted of a felony offense to enter into CDCR adult institutions/facilities or camps, or youth institutions/facilities or camps in the nighttime, without the prior approval of the Warden or officer in charge. It is also illegal for an individual to enter onto these premises for unauthorized purposes or to refuse to leave said premises when requested to do so. Failure to comply with this provision could lead to prosecution.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 602, 4570.5 and 4571; CCR, Title 15, Sections 3173 and 3289; WIC Section 1001.7.
- f. Encouraging and/or assisting prison inmates to escape, is a crime. It is illegal to bring firearms, deadly weapons, explosives, tear gas, drugs, or drug paraphernalia on CDCR institutions/facilities or camp premises. It is illegal to give prison inmates or wards firearms, explosives, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or any drug or drug paraphernalia, including cocaine or marijuana. It is illegal to give wards sex-oriented objects or devices, and written materials and pictures whose sale is prohibited to minors.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 2772, 2790, 4533, 4535, 4550, 4573, 4573.5, 4573.6 and 4574; Title 15, Sections 4681 and 4710; WIC Sections 1001.5 and 1152.
- g. It is illegal to give or take letters from inmates or wards without the authorization of the Warden or officer in charge. It is also illegal to give or receive any type of gift and/or gratuities from prison inmates or wards.
  - SOURCE: PC Sections 2540, 2541 and 4570; CCR, Title 15, Sections 3010, 3399, 3401, 3424, 3425 and 4045; WIC Section 1712.
- h. In an emergency situation, the visiting program and other program activities may be suspended.

SOURCE: PC Section 2601; CCR, Title 15, Sections 3383, 4002.5 and 4696.

i. For security reasons, visitors must not wear clothing that in any way resembles state issued prison inmate or ward clothing (blue denim shirts, blue denim pants).

j. Interviews with SPECIFIC INMATES are not permitted. Conspiring with an inmate to circumvent policy and/or regulations constitutes a rule violation that may result in appropriate legal action. Interviews with individual wards are permitted with written consent of each ward if he is 18 years of age or older, or with written consent of a parent, legal guardian, or committing court, if 17 years of age or younger.

SOURCE: CCR, Title 15, Sections 3261.5, 3315(a)(3)(X), and 3177 and 4700(a)(1).

#### 8. Clothing Restrictions

While on institution grounds, Contractor and all its agents, employees, and/or representatives shall be professionally and appropriately dressed in clothing distinct from that worn by inmates at the institution. Specifically, blue denim pants and blue chambray shirts, orange/red/yellow/white/chartreuse jumpsuits and/or yellow rainwear shall not be worn onto institution grounds, as this is inmate attire. The Contractor should contact the institution regarding clothing restrictions prior to requiring access to the institution to assure the Contractor and their employees are in compliance.

#### 9. Tobacco-Free Environment

Pursuant to Penal Code Section 5030.1, the use of tobacco products by any person on the grounds of any institution or facility under the jurisdiction of CDCR is prohibited.

#### 10. Security Regulations

- a. Unless otherwise directed by the entrance gate officer and/or Contract Manager, the Contractor, Contractor's employees, and subcontractors shall enter the institution through the main entrance gate and park private and nonessential vehicles in the designated visitor's parking lot. Contractor, Contractor's employees, and subcontractors shall remove the keys from the ignition when outside the vehicle and all unattended vehicles shall be locked and secured while on institution grounds.
- b. Any State- and Contractor-owned equipment used by the Contractor for the provision of contract services, shall be rendered temporarily inoperative by the Contractor when not in use, by locking or other means unless specified otherwise.
- c. In order to maintain institution safety and security, periodic fire prevention inspections and site searches may become necessary, and Contractor must furnish keys to institutional authorities to access all locked areas on the worksite. The State shall in no way be responsible for Contractor's loss due to fire.
- d. Due to security procedures, the Contractor, Contractor's employees, and subcontractors may be delayed at the institution vehicle/pedestrian gates and sally ports. Any loss of time checking in and out of the institution gates and sally ports shall

be borne by the Contractor.

- e. Contractor, Contractor's employees, and subcontractors shall observe all security rules and regulations and comply with all instructions given by institutional authorities.
- f. Electronic and communicative devices such as pagers, cell phones and cameras/micro cameras are not permitted on institution grounds.
- g. Contractor, Contractor's employees, and subcontractors shall not cause undue interference with the operations of the institution.
- h. No picketing is allowed on State property.

#### 11. Gate Clearance

Contractor and Contractor's employee(s) and/or subcontractor(s) must be cleared prior to providing services. The Contractor will be required to complete a Request for Gate Clearance for all persons entering the facility a minimum of ten (10) working days prior to commencement of service. The Request for Gate Clearance must include the person's name, social security number, valid state driver's license number or state identification card number and date of birth. Information shall be submitted to the Contract Liaison or his/her designee. CDCR uses the Request for Gate Clearance to run a California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS) check. The check will include Department of Motor Vehicles check, Wants and Warrants check, and Criminal History check.

Gate clearance may be denied for the following reasons: Individual's presence in the institution presents a serious threat to security, individual has been charged with a serious crime committed on institution property, inadequate information is available to establish positive identity of prospective individual, and/or individual has deliberately falsified his/her identity.

All persons entering the facilities must have a valid state driver's license or photo identification card on their person.

Re: Annual Rate adjustment for Solid Waste and Recycling Services for 2024-2025

Dear Ms. Guitierrez:

We have prepared for your review the solid waste rate adjustments based upon the formulas within our Franchise Agreement.

As provided for in the 2022 restated and amended agreement in Article 6, Sections 6.3 through 6.4 of the Franchise Agreement between the City of Calipatria and CR&R Incorporated for Integrated Solid Waste Management, the rates illustrated in Exhibit "3A" shall be adjusted annually to reflect the change in various cost categories of the Producers Price Index (PPI) and the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The indexes used are the actual December to December indexes for 2022 to 2023. Due to the notification requirement, some indexes are considered preliminary (P), but often do not change when finalized. The annual adjustment is limited to a maximum of 4% annually and is implemented July 1st of each year.

As such, we have supplied copies of the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics for the 12-month change (December to December). The calculations utilized in the attached Forms give an exact number to each category, based upon our contractual arrangement. The contractual CPI index has also been utilized for the disposal change. Rates for services not listed in the attached worksheets will be adjusted according to the percentage change within each service type category.

With your review and approval, the adjustments will be implemented with the both the City and CR&R's July 1, 2024 billing.

As always, it is a pleasure being of service to the City of Calipatria.

#### Background:

On January 25, 2005, the City adopted Ordinance 05-002 establishing sewer connection charges and sewer use fees. As City staff continues to review/audit utility accounts to ensure accuracy of set ordinance charges accordingly, records do not show that the City has charged the annual fee of \$100.00. The ordinance section reads as follows:

#### Section 2.

B. For each sewer connection or user, now existing or hereafter created, by property owners or users outside of the corporate limits of the City of Calipatria, in addition to the foregoing connection and user fee charges, each user shall pay the sum of \$100.00 per year, or any fraction thereof, in advance, due on July 1 of each and every year.

The loss of revenue to the Sewer Fund over a period of 18 years is approximately \$1.2 million dollars.

#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council authorize moving forward the \$100 annual fee to the billing effective July 1, 2024, printed bills.

#### **ORDINANCE 05-002**

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CALIPATRIA, CALIFORNIA ESTABLISHING SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES AND SEWER USE FEES

The City Council of the City of Calipatria does hereby ordain as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: Ordinance number 276, passed and adopted January 8, 1991 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2: The City Council of the City of Calipatria does hereby establish, determine and impose the following fees and charges to be paid to the City of Calipatria for the facilities and services furnished and rendered by the City of Calipatria for the connection to and use of its sanitary sewage system:

A. For each new, additional or renewal sewer connection or user, within and without the City limits, whether for housing, commercial or industrial purposes, specifically including restructuring of any residential, commercial or industrial units within the structure, a connection fee of \$1,200.00 per unit shall be imposed.

B. For each sewer connection or user, now existing or hereafter created, by property owners or users outside of the corporate limits of the City of Calipatria, in addition to the foregoing connection and user fee charges, each user shall pay the sum of \$100.00 per year, or any fraction thereof, in advance, due on July 1 of each and every year.

SECTION 3: The City Council of the City of Calipatria does hereby establish, determine and impose the followings fees and charges to be paid for sewer availability and use:

Residential (single family) Business Office	\$22.05 per month \$24.56 per month
Gas Station	\$41.26 per month
Beauty Shop Restaurant	\$49.60 per month
Store & Laundry	\$57.93 per month
School	\$94.94 per month \$341.40 per month

4-unit	\$44.10 per month \$55.12 per month
5-unit	\$66.15 per month
6-unit	\$77.17 per month

SECTION 4: The foregoing fees and charges shall be paid to the City Clerk.

SECTION 5: No property owner, user or person shall willfully fail, neglect or refuse to pay any of the charges or fees as established herein. The property owner shall be the responsible person for all of the above fees and charges. Upon failure of any person to pay when due any fee or charge provided herein, the City of Calipatria shall discontinue all sanitary sewage services and facilities to the property and shall not resume the services and facilities until all delinquent charges, including additional connection charges have been paid.

SECTION 6: The City of Calipatria may contract with a person or agency, public or private, for the collection of the foregoing charges.

SECTION 7: The charges herein provided shall be and constitute a lien upon the real property served, and may be collected by the City by personal action against the owner and/or occupant of said property, or by foreclosure of said lien.

SECTION 8: This ordinance shall take effect sixty days from and after its adoption, and prior to the expiration of 15 days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Imperial Valley Press, a newspaper of general circulation.
